Last Jammin' In July concert rescheduled

Alpen Musikanten plays Towne Lake Park Aug. 13

McKINNEY, TEXAS (Aug. 6, 2009) – McKinney has rescheduled the last of its popular music in the park series, Jammin in July, for Thursday, Aug. 13. The concert originally scheduled for July 30 was postponed due to rain. Alpen Musikanten will now bring its German oom-pah sounds to Towne Lake Park, 1405 Wilson Creek Parkway, on Thursday, Aug. 13 at 7:30.

During the first three of the four-concert series, hundreds showed up to enjoy the park, the music and the company. Groups perform on McKinney's portable stage, which will sit in the clearing near the volleyball court, providing plenty of lawn seating. Concert attendees are encouraged to bring blankets, chairs or a picnic basket, but alcohol is not allowed in city parks.

The Jammin' in July series is presented by the McKinney Parks, Recreation and Open Space Department. All concerts start at 7:30 p.m. Admission and parking are free.
