Jammin' In June starts this week in McKinney

Free concerts in the park series every Thursday evening

McKINNEY, TEXAS (June 7, 2010) – McKinney brings back its popular music in the park series, Jammin in June, starting this Thursday, June 10. Local musicians are warming up their instruments for the outdoor evening concerts at Towne Lake Park, 1405 Wilson Creek Parkway.

Jammin' in June runs every Thursday in June from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. Groups will perform on McKinney's portable stage, which will sit in the clearing near the volleyball court, providing plenty of lawn seating. The line-up includes Needfire on June 10, Studio 54 on June 17 and the John Wynn String Fever on June 24.

"Last year, we had hundreds show up for this free concert series. The music this year is a unique mix from area groups, and we know that residents will love what we have in store for them," said Recreation Superintendent Charlie Bryant. "We're excited to have another opportunity to bring people out to our parks so they can enjoy our wonderful sense of community and listen to great music."

Admission and parking are free. Concert attendees are encouraged to bring blankets, chairs or a picnic basket, but alcohol is not allowed in city parks. The Jammin' in June series is a collaborative effort of the McKinney Parks & Recreation Department and the Creative Arts Alliance.
