



CAN THE FATS, OILS AND GREASE

Stop the clog. Fats, oils, and grease (FOG) create a huge problem for sewer pipes. FOG can create massive clogs that cause sewer backups and overflows resulting in costly repairs.

- **Can It!** Once cooled, pour leftover oils and grease into a sturdy container.
- **Scrape It!** Before washing, scrape out fats, oils and grease from pots, pans and dishes
- **Trash It!** Put fatty and greasy food scraps in the garbage, **not down the drain.**

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

McKinney's Stormwater Management Program is designed to control pollutants in our streams and lakes by meeting requirements set forth by the Texas Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (TPDES) permit. The program contains multiple elements including storm system mapping and maintenance, construction permits and inspections, source control inspections, spill response, illicit discharge investigations and public education.

Stormwater pollutants find their way into what we drink and where we swim. Everything that goes into our storm drains - grass clippings, oil, pesticides, pet waste, etc. - makes its way to our creeks and lakes. It all adds up. Stormwater contamination is our biggest source of water pollution.

There are many things that you can do around your home and in everyday life to help reduce stormwater pollution. Consider the benefits on our local waters and wildlife if everyone took these simple steps.

Healthy habits for cleaner water:

- Never put anything in a storm drain
- Dispose of trash properly
- Pick up after your pet
- Minimize the use of fertilizers, herbicides and pesticides
- Sweep up grass clippings from driveways and sidewalks

RESIDENTIAL WASTE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION



TRASH COLLECTION

- To prevent spillage, make sure the lid of your cart is completely closed and facing the street. Bag all loose material.
- Set your green cart out by 7 a.m. on your trash collection day.
- Allow at least 3 feet of space around your cart.
- Large families may request an additional recycling cart or a second trash cart for an additional fee by contacting the Utility Billing at **972-547-7550**.



YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Progressive Waste Solutions will collect bagged grass and other yard waste, and up to 10 bundles of tree limbs on your regular collection day using a different truck. Limbs must be cut in lengths less than four feet and securely tied into bundles not to exceed 50 pounds.

CURBSIDE RECYCLING COLLECTION

- Set your blue recycling cart out by 7 a.m. on your scheduled trash collection day.
- Allow at least 3 feet of space around your cart.

BULKY WASTE COLLECTION

Bulky items, which can be loaded by two people in less than five minutes, will be picked up at each residence up to 12 times per year at no charge. Bulky items are collected on the same day as your trash and recyclables using a different truck.

- Yard Waste:** Yard clippings and limbs may be brought to the Regional Disposal Facility or the Custer Road Transfer Station for composting
- Mulch, Compost and Topsoil:** All may be purchased by bag or by truck load from the Custer Road Transfer Station

Requirements:

Identification: Valid Texas Driver's License matching address on current City of McKinney water bill. Please bring your current water bill at time of drop off.

Transportation: Load **MUST** be covered to be accepted by the facility.

Fees: The first two (2) visits per household, per month are at no cost to the resident.



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE
