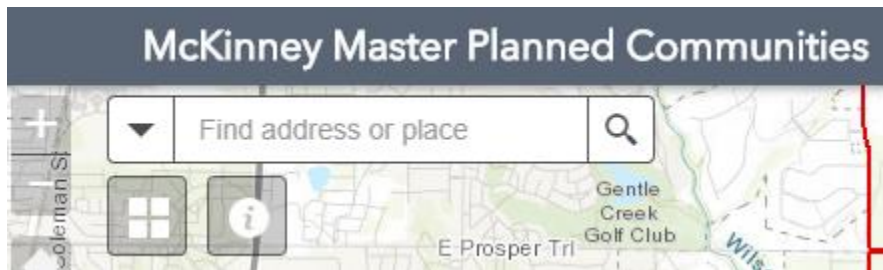


Search by Address

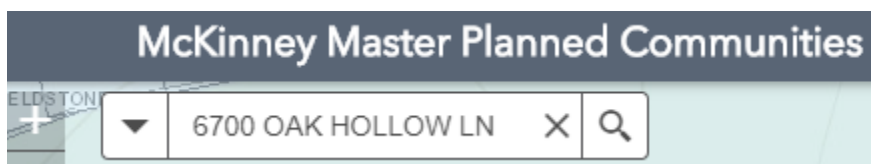
At the top of the map, there is a search box to search for either an address or a subdivision. By default, it is set to search for all addresses and subdivisions in the map.



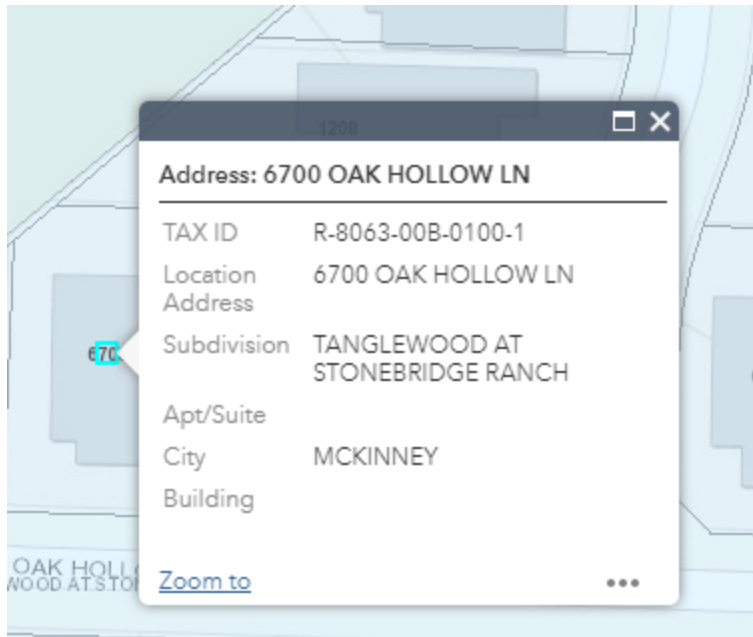
If you wish to determine if an address is within a Master Planned Community, or if you wish to know which subdivision it falls within, click the drop down arrow and select “McKinney Address layer”



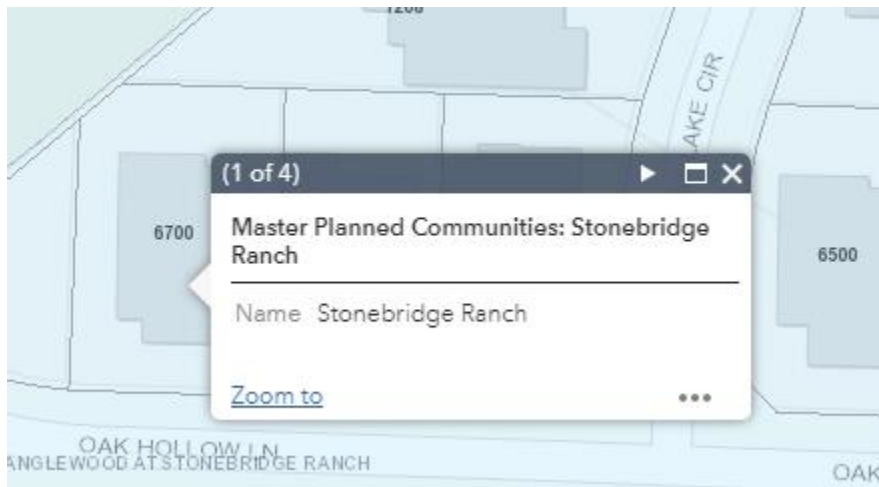
Type the address into the search box and click search.

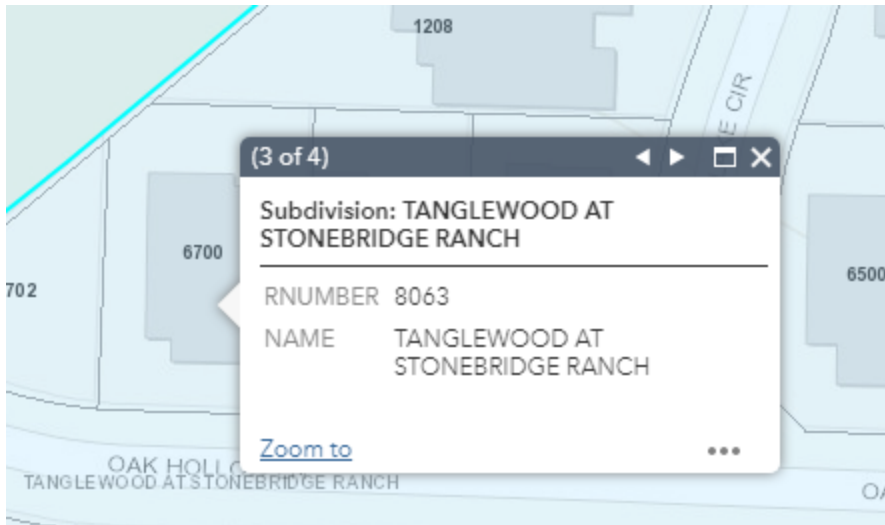


The map will zoom to the address and a popup window will be displayed.



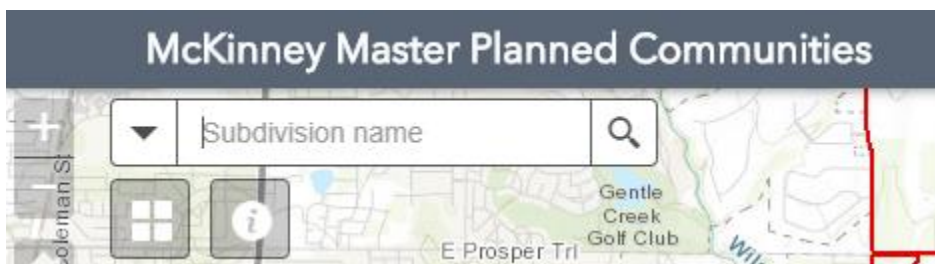
Close the popup and click on the address again and toggle through the tabs to see the name of the community display in the **Master Planned Communities** tab. You will also be able to see on the map that it falls within one of the colored areas representing these communities, as shown in the map Legend. In the popup, there may also be a **Subdivision** tab that names the Subdivision that the address falls within.



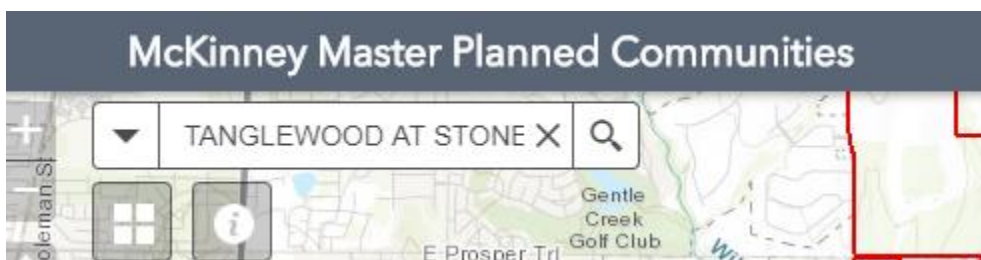


Search by Subdivision

If you have a subdivision and you wish to determine if it is within a Master Planned Community, Click the drop down arrow and select “Subdivision name”



Enter the name of the subdivision and hit enter to search.



The map will zoom to the subdivision.



Click the subdivision on the map to display a popup window. In the popup, click on the arrows to toggle through the tabs of information. If the address is within a Master Planned Community, there will be a tab called **Master Planned Communities**, and the name of the community will display, for example "Stonebridge Ranch". You will also be able to see on the map that the subdivision falls within one of the colored areas representing these communities, as shown in the map Legend.
